

JUDY NEWTON, MISSIONARY, LEADS FIRST “DISCIPLE” CLASS IN JAPAN

Judy Newton, our U.M. missionary in northeast Japan, is co-teaching the very first “Disciple” class in Japan, with 18 eager students. Three people come from Ashiya Sanjo – including Toi San, who brings her seeing-eye dog. Eight attend from Kobe Union Church, including two non-Japanese; and seven come from Kwansei Gakuin University, all English doctoral students, two of whom are Christians.

“Several in the class have talked with me about the thrill of drinking deeply of the Biblical springs. We’re all thirsty for more,” Judy says in her Oct. 18 letter about the group, which began in August.
